### AGRIBUSINESS ECONOMICS & MANAGEMENT B.S.

If your plan is to go into a business related career, whether it involves agriculture or not, this major can get you there. Agribusiness is the intersection of business and agriculture. It covers everything related to food production, from seeds to sales, from farms to factories, from turf to transport to table.

*USA Today-Money* recently rated Agricultural Economics as the second best major for high employability upon graduation. Agricultural Economics majors have a very low 0.74% unemployment rate.

Whether a student wants to manage the production of food and fiber, regulate the use of natural resources, start their own business, or manage a large agribusiness corporation, our programs are flexible enough to meet their unique needs. There are two emphasis areas in Agribusiness Economics & Management: Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness Management. Agribusiness Management requires the Business Administration minor.
